

Mr Brady Frazier

January 6, 1921 - September 24, 2017

Brady Frazier was born on January 6, 1921 to Canada and Annie Mae Frazier in Virgil, Oklahoma. He was first born of 13 children and two adopted children.

He was preceded in death by his parents; 11 siblings; and his first wife, Ethel Mae Hooks Frazier; and his second wife, Cordelia Wright Frazier.

Brady received his Elementary and secondary education from Dunbar School in Shawnee, Oklahoma and Douglass High School in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. He attended Langston University where he was known for his leadership and mentoring skills.

Brady accepted Christ at a very early age and was baptized.

He united with the Loving Stjames Baptist Church under the pastoral of Rev J. Vance Jenkins. He was a loyal servant there for many years. He continued his dedication under the pastorage of Rev W B. Parker who is also a dear friend. His loyalty continued under the Pastorage of Rev. Eddie White. He served as the Chairman of the Deacon Board, a Sunday school and BTU teacher, a youth counselor, and oversaw many youth programs. His leadership and mentoring skills have been a great role model for many youth.

In 1943 Brady enlisted and served in the United States Army at Camp Chaffee, Arkansas. He was a World War II veteran. For 37 years he worked for the Federal government at Tinker Air Force Base as a first-line supervisor where he received many awards and recognitions; he encouraged many people in his workplace. He retired in 1979 from Civil Service. To follow his passion for the youth, he went to work for Oklahoma City Public Schools as a bus driver for 32 years.

On May 28, 1942, Brady united in marriage to Ethel Mae Hooks. To this union, five children were born - one daughter, and four sons. He later married Cordelia Wright.

He leaves to cherish is memory, one daughter, Queen Taft of Plano, TX; four sons: Willard Frazier Jones (Micky) of Oklahoma City, OK, Wallace Frazier (Erma) of Lawton, OK, Danny Frazier of Midwest City, OK, and Dennis Frazier of Oklahoma City, OK; 15 grandchildren; 27 great-grandchildren; two great-great-grandchildren, all who were the sparkles in his eyes; two sisters, Velma Evans of Spencer, OK and Alice Stanfield of Oklahoma City, OK; two adopted sisters, Diana Carter of Oklahoma City, OK and Lisa Rose of Midwest City, OK; a dear friend, Pauline Pennon; and a host of nieces, nephews, family and friends.

His mild manor and gentle disposition impacted the young and the old. He will truly be missed by many.
