On Sunday, April 8, 1934, a beautiful bouncing baby girl was born to Mr. Donald and Mrs. Ethel Lee Maynor Hickman in Sapulpa, Oklahoma. She was the oldest daughter and second child of ten children and was called "Sister" by her siblings, family and special friends.

She graduated from Booker T. Washington High School in Sapulpa in 1954. After graduation, she married Albert Vernon (AV) Coburn, her high school classmate and sweetheart. To this union two children were born Myron Vernon and Rhoda Christina. Later, (AV) enlisted into the United States Army Air Forces in Fort Bragg, North Carolina. During this time, she returned to school and earned a Certificate in Religious Studies. She became an Ordained Minister in 1959 at Freewill Baptist Church in Fayetteville, North Carolina. She returned to Oklahoma and enrolled in the Langston University School of Religion and earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Theology. Upon graduation, she relocated to Oklahoma City, and became a member of Fairview Baptist Church under the leadership of Dr. John Reed, Jr. She has been a member

for over 50 years. Later, she returned to Langston and received a bachelor's degree in Elementary Education. Her further studies included Oral Roberts University in Tulsa, Oklahoma, and the University of South Florida in Tampa, Florida.

She taught in the Oklahoma City Public School System and retired after 25 years. At the request of the school system, she continued as a Substitute for 30 more years. While continuing her teaching, preaching, and missionary work she met Ms. Carrie Holloway, known as "Mother Holloway Founder of the Oklahoma Citywide Prayer Band." She played a major role in the development and success of the Prayer Band. After working with Mother Holloway for years, Coburn envisioned having a Prayer group in Sapulpa, her hometown. Thus, in 1978, she established the Sapulpa Prayer Band at Macedonia Baptist Church. It has been very successful, and it not only survived but thrived under her leadership for 43 years. The Prayer Band is known for its Annual Day of Prayer, held at Calvary Baptist Church, in Sapulpa.

Reverend Coburn loved her church, pastor, everyone, and any place that the Word was present. At Fairview she served on the Deaconess Board, taught Sunday school, instructed in the Oklahoma Baptist Convention, East Zion District Association, National Baptist Convention, and the Oklahoma School of Religion. She taught and preached at many churches and served as chaplain in many organizations.

Her spiritual calling and revelation coupled with the gift and ability to teach, catapulted her into a traveling evangelism ministry. She was blessed to travel extensively throughout the world spreading the good news of the Gospel of Jesus Christ which includes but not limited to: The Holy Land in Israel, the Caribbean including Jamaica, Hawaii, the Virgin Islands, Mexico, London England, Vienna Austria, Madrid, and Barcelona Spain, and Lisbon Portugal and several countries in Africa, including Gabon, Nigeria, Senegal, and South Africa several times.

Throughout the years, she received many honors and awards for the work she

did to serve people nationally and internationally. Due to her love for prayer, she is the author of a book entitled "A Book of Prayers," a collection of spiritual prayers. Evangelist Coburn spent a lifetime praying for people nationally and internationally. Her passionate prayers are consecrated in spirit and scripture. Her book of prayers is timely and there is something for everyone, including teachers, ministers, health professionals, and families. These powerful prayers to God are a blessing to all who read them.

On Wednesday morning, March 17, 2021, at 6:32AM the Lord picked a perfect rose and called Reverend Coburn home.
