Reflections on the Life of:

Joyce Marie Branham-Thompson

Her Beginning:

Joyce Marie Branham-Thompson entered this world on July 26, 1938 in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Logwood and Elvira Branham, her parents (both deceased), reared her in a spiritual and loving home. Her early childhood was partially spent in Bartlesville, OK and Temple, TX with her aunt Bernice. Joyce accepted Christ at an early age as she joined Pleasant Grove Baptist Church under Reverend Marshall. In 1967 she then became a member of Tabitha Baptist Church where she remained up until her death. Joyce was heavily involved in the following committees within the church: Usher Board: 1965-1991 Prayer Counselor: Vice-President Women's Missionary Union-Vice President Senior Citizen Committee.

Education:

Joyce started her education in Temple, TX. Once she moved to Oklahoma City, Joyce attended Douglass High School where she was always honored for her high-grade point averages. Joyce was a part of the Douglass High School band as she was a majorette, she also played additional sports (track, softball, etc.) Her senior year she moved back to Temple, TX and graduated. Upon graduation she returned to Oklahoma City where she enrolled at Bacone College in Muskogee, OK, and obtained a degree in Early Childhood Education. She then later attended Oklahoma City University where she received her

certification in Montessori Education.

History of Work and Service:

Joyce's work included working at Ole Blessed Martin Catholic School as an educator for seven years. In addition, she worked part time for Metropolitan Insurance Co. as an insurance agent. Joyce also served as a Head Start Director at Dunjee School from 1972-1976. In 1976, she entered the Oklahoma City Police Academy and served there for 20 years. On September 1, 1996 she retired as a Detective Sergeant. Joyce was honored as the first African American female to retire from the Oklahoma City Police Department. Joyce was heavily involved in her community as she was also a member of the Eastern Star-Dr. MLK #110 DARCUS #41 (Golden Circle). She also was an active volunteer at OU Medical Center. Joyce was also a member of the following organizations: Women in Law Enforcement of the State of Oklahoma Fraternal Order of Police OKC prior president of the OKC Lioness Retired OKC Police Officers Association.

End of Life:

Joyce precedes her death by both parents, three sisters, two brothers, three daughters, one son, and one grandson. She will be sorely missed by her daughter, Rozetta Thompson, of Oklahoma City, OK; 15 grand kids, 42 great-grand kids, great-great grandkids, and a host of other relatives and friends.
