Juanita Daisy King was born on November 2, 1921, in Luther, Oklahoma. She was a loving sister and daughter to her five brothers and six sisters, to Harry Hampton Lee, and Rachel Gracie Lee (Tyson), all of whom have preceded her in death.

Mother King graduated from Washington High School in Luther, Oklahoma in 1939. She continued her education throughout the years, attending Bigger College in Oklahoma City, C.H. Mason Bible College, and Lakewood Business College.

She married Harrel King on November 9, 1952 in Los Angeles, California, where they lived for ten years. She started her career early, working alongside her sister Annie at Bud's Grocery and then transitioned to working in Navy Supply. Deacon and Mother King moved back to Oklahoma City in 1963. Mother King worked for St. Anthony Hospital followed by working independently for families in Oklahoma City. She later accepted a position with the Lewis family in 1978, where she retired from in 2000. She spent the next few years as the devoted wife she was of 64 years caring for her husband until his passing December 13, 2007.

Mother King was most proud of her work with the local, district and International Church of God in Christ. She joined the Sixth and Jordan COGIC under the leadership of Bishop W.E. Jefferies in 1972, and served until the present at Victory Temple COGIC under Bishop Malcolm W. Coby. She received numerous commendations and awards throughout her years of service with the church.

She developed a love for basketball and never missed a OKC Thunder game. She was loved by all those who knew her. You could never leave her presence or conversation without a smile and renewed sense of the love of Jesus. She always encouraged those in whatever season or struggle in life they may be in. One of her favorite ways to end a conversation was “I love you and Jesus loves you, too.”

On August 21, 2020, Mother King passed from Earth to Glory. She leaves to cherish her memory, daughter Ashley Monroe, grandson Grant Ehret, several great nieces, nephews, cousins, and a host of family and friends.
