She was christened at an early age at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Grayson, Oklahoma. Upon adulthood, Mary moved to Tulsa, Oklahoma where she made it her home for a short period of time. Mary lived at Regency Tower Apartment Building in downtown Oklahoma City for 47 years. She was well known and loved by all who knew her. She would sit

down in the lobby every evening with greetings and well wishes to everyone who

passed her by.

She was a very active member of St. Joseph Catholic Church. She was a greeter

on Sunday mornings and loved volunteering anywhere she was needed. She also

volunteered many days helping in the aftermath of the tragic Murrah Building bombing

on April 15th 1995. She was given the Lady of achievement award by her Church family

for her outstanding volunteer efforts in making sandwiches and feeding the homeless

in her community.

Mary was preceded in death by her parents Adren and Eula Goudeau; her husband

Tommy Slaughter; her four sisters Teresa Carear, Louis Johnson, Florence Reed, and

Celestine Johnson; her two brothers Curtis Goudeau and Freeman Goudeau; her son

David Williams; and (step daughter) Vickie Slaughter.

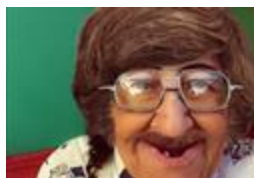
